This panel by Lagrenée, is the one which was exhibited at the Salon du Louvre in 1777 and was thought lost ever since. Thanks to the sketches of Gabriel de Saint Aubin on his copy of *Livret* and to the given dimensions, there is no doubt that this is that panel. Although Saint Aubin's is only a hasty sketch, one can clearly make out Lagrenée's five feminine characters, as well as the altar, the foreground ewer, the drapery in the rear and the circular architecture of the temple.
